- The Governor, in partnership with local leadership, may authorize a county to move to the next phase, upon request of the mayor or county administrator.

Partner Spotlight: School District of Palm Beach County

The School District of Palm Beach County will start the 2020-2021 school year with distance learning on Monday, August 31. On July 16, 2020, the School Board approved the Superintendent's recommendation to keep students in a remote learning environment until health conditions improve in Palm Beach County. The Superintendent's Health Advisory Committee, which is assisting Superintendent Fennoy in making decisions on school reopening, is an example of strong community partnerships in Palm Beach County. The Committee includes the Health Care District, DOH-Palm Beach, Quantum Foundation, JFK Medical Center, Jupiter Medical Center, and the Riviera Beach Housing Authority to name a few. 
DOH-Palm Beach Officials Issue Mosquito-Borne Illness Advisory

The Florida Department of Health in Palm Beach County (DOH-Palm Beach) today advised residents there has been an increase in mosquito-borne disease activity in areas of Palm Beach County. A locally acquired human case of West Nile illness has been confirmed and there is a heightened concern additional residents may become ill. County Health Director for DOH-Palm Beach, Dr. Alina Alonso, reminds residents and visitors to avoid being bitten by mosquitoes and to take basic precautions such as covering skin with clothing or repellent to help limit exposure.
