## SUBSTANCE USE DASHBOARD

Accurate, consistent and easy-to-use information on **Substance Use Disorder** is key to using resources effectively to address the challenges of this growing public health concern.

The Florida Department of Health has launched—and is routinely updating—the **Substance Use Dashboard**, compiling a variety of statistics on topics including overdose incidents, prescriptions issued, administered naloxone and more.

## Florida Health Charts: Substance Use Dashboard

- The Substance Use Dashboard offers consistent annual statistics dating back to 2015. This can help with understanding trends over time.
- The dashboard provides information on:
  - Frequency of overdoses.
  - Number of prescriptions issued.
  - · Incidents of high-risk behaviors.
  - Number of drug arrests among juvenile and adult offenders.
  - Number of motor vehicle incidents involving alcohol, drugs or a combination of the two.
  - Occurrences of Neonatal Abstinence Syndrome.
  - Substance use program enrollment numbers.
  - Use of naloxone.
- Annual data is available at the state and county level.
- State and county statistics regarding naloxone use in overdose response can be used for any public health messaging regarding its safety and effectiveness.
  - Naloxone was administered about 20,000 times in 2015 and about 35,000 times in 2019, indicating both increased awareness of the response and increased need for overdose response.
