

How does the **Good Samaritan Act** protect me?

Know your rights. Save a life. **Call 911.**



Section 893.21, Florida Statutes

Protects people who call 911 and the person who is overdosing from being charged with or penalized for:

- Possession or use of drug paraphernalia
- Possession of less than 4 grams of a controlled substance
- Use of drugs
- Violation of a condition of pre-trial release, probation or parole




Florida's Good Samaritan Act does not protect against open warrants and other crimes.

Section 768.13, Florida Statutes

Protects people who act in good faith from civil damages that:

- Call 911 for a drug overdose
- Use naloxone or another type of drug reversal medication for a drug overdose
